Since the last newsletter the First Response Team has responded to 2 medical emergencies.

Fall is here and it's time to ask yourself, is your heating system healthy? Your furnace, fireplace or woodstove need yearly checkups to ensure they operate safely and efficiently. Heating appliances should be cleaned and inspected annually to prevent fires and deadly carbon monoxide gas in your home by a qualified service technician.



Not only do the heating appliances need to be checked annually, but also your chimney should be checked to ensure it is in safe working order. Fires often result from a build-up of creosote in the chimney. A blocked chimney can also cause deadly carbon monoxide gas to enter your home, so check for the signs of corrosion or deterioration and for birds' or squirrels' nests. Your chimney should be cleaned and inspected at least once a year by a professional wood energy technician.

Remember - a healthy heating system is a safe heating system.

Here are a few more suggestions on how to fireproof your home.

- Install a carbon monoxide alarm,
- Give space heaters space (at least 3 feet away from flammable items,
- Use a fire screen in front of a fireplace, and
- Store discarded ashes in a non-combustible pail with a right fitting lid.

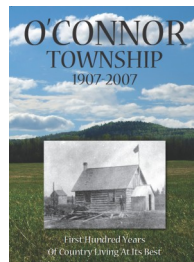

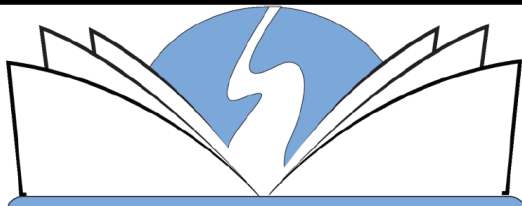

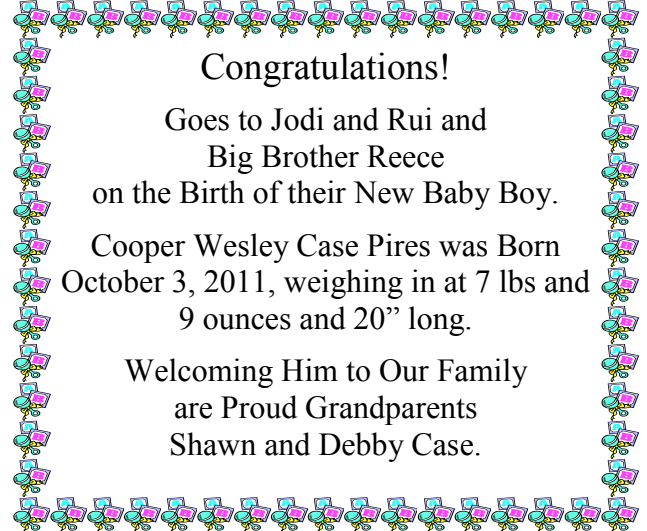
