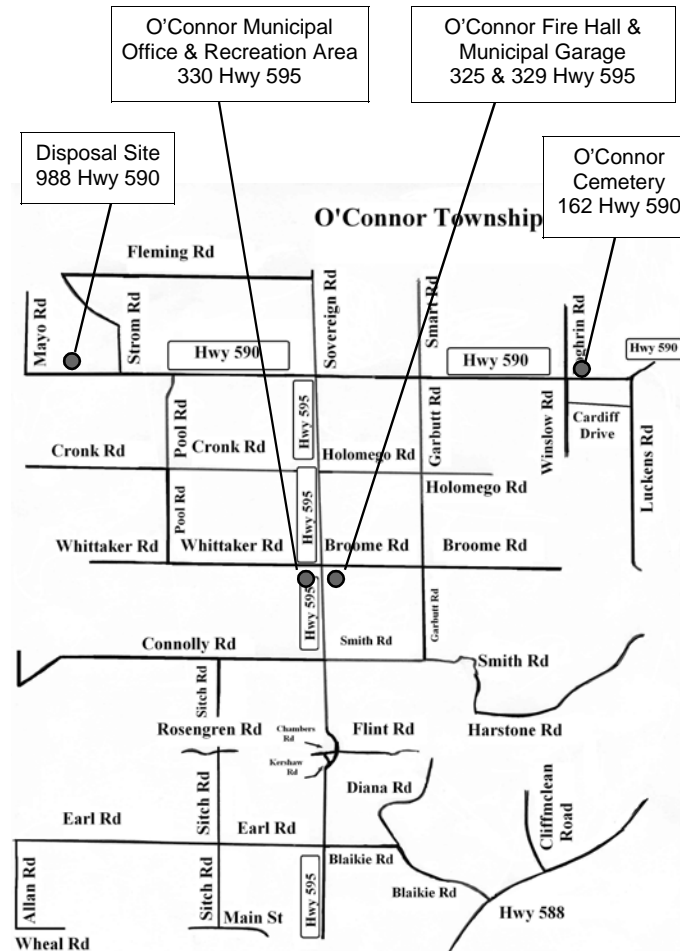

Disposal Site Recycling Depots



Please do your part to reduce the amount of material that is landfilled at this site by recycling when possible. This pamphlet outlines the various materials that are accepted for recycling. All recycling depots are clearly identified and if you are uncertain as to where you should be placing your items please ask the Disposal Site Attendant for help.

Rules and Regulations:

- ◆ All users must be residents of the Township of O'Connor.
 - ◆ Residents must have a Disposal Site Permit.
 - ◆ Prohibited items include
 - Liquid Waste, e.g. waste oils flammables, paints, sewage
 - Animal carcasses
 - ◆ Obey posted signs. Residents must deposit waste and recyclables in designated areas:
 - Burn Pile
 - brush and tree limbs
 - clean wood
 - No furniture
 - No windows
 - No shingles
 - No painted or varnished wood
 - No pressure treated wood
 - Upholstery & Furniture
 - Glass (no lids)
 - Scrap Metal
 - No wood
 - No plastic
 - No Upholstery
 - No Electronics
 - Dry empty paint cans permitted
 - Electronics Only
 - Tires - No rims

Payment must be made at the municipal office prior to disposal and receipt shown to Disposal Site Attendant

Disposal of refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners:

The fee for residents to disposal of these items is \$20.00 per unit. Payment must be made at the Municipal office at 330 Hwy 595. All doors must be removed from the units and the receipt number written on the door and body of the item using something that is permanent and will not wash off.

Recycling Bins

The recycling bins at the disposal site have two compartments. One compartment accepts pop cans, plastic bottles, steel cans, milk cartons/tetra packs. The other compartment accepts paper and cardboard products.

Waste Electronics and Electrical Equipment (WEEE) are to be placed in the sheltered area provided. Phase one of the Ministry of the Environment's WEEE program which came into effect on April 1, 2009, captures computers, peripherals (mice, keyboards), monitors, printers and televisions. Phase two of the program, which will take effect April 1, 2010, will capture telephones, copiers, stereos, radios, MP3 players and other audio-visual equipment.

Yes

- #1 plastics PET - pop bottles, water bottles
- #2 plastic PET - household cleaner bottles, e.g. shampoo dish soap

- #3 - #7 plastics
- Shopping bags
- Plastic wrap
- Baggies
- Styrofoam
- Plastic tubs & lids
- Containers with hazardous wastes e.g. motor oil

MILK CARTONS/TETRA PAKS



Yes

- Milk cartons
- Juice boxes
- Tetra or gable top containers
