2023 INTERIM TAX BILLS

The Interim tax bills will be mailed out during the first week of February. These bills will include the first two of four installments for the 2023 year. Due dates for the Interim Tax Bills are February 28th and April 28th. The interim billing is based on 50% of your previous years property taxes. Once the 2023 budget is approved and the rates have been finalized, the final billing, which includes the last two installments for 2023 will be issued. Payments of cash or cheque can be dropped off at the Municipal Office located at 330 Hwy 595. Alternative methods of payment include etransfer, internet or telephone banking. When sending etransfers, you must send a separate email to the township at twpoconn@tbaytel.net with the password so that the etransfer can be accepted. Otherwise, your bill will remain outstanding. COMMITTEE OF ADJUSTMENT

The Township of O'Connor is currently looking for one person to sit on the Committee of Adjustment. The Committee is comprised of three members which include one Council member and two non-Council members. The Committee makes decisions on any minor variance applications, that are received from a property owner, in respect of land, building, structures or the use thereof. When the proposed development of lands does not conform to the Township's Zoning By-law or Official Plan but where the general intent and purpose of the by-law and the plan are maintained or application is required. Interested persons may submit a letter to Council by Monday, February 13, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. at the O'Connor Municipal Office located at 330 Highway 595. Council will review the letters at their meeting that evening.

By-law Number 2016-12, being a by-law respecting Construction, Demolition, Inspections, and to set out the rates for permits within the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor states that building permits will be required for the construction, erection, alteration, repair, removal, relocation and change of use of all buildings, decks or structures within the Township of O'Connor. If you are building anything larger than 161.2 square feet or any building with heating and/or plumbing, you are required to apply for a building permit. DISPOSAL SITE

Not sure what to do on these cold wintery days? Now is the perfect time to declutter your house! But don't throw those items away. Reuse, repurpose or donate!






This is a reminder that the LRCA does not monitor ice conditions at any of our Conservation Areas. Make yourself aware of weather conditions before heading out to explore, and always ensure you are dressed appropriately and are wearing appropriate footwear while visiting. There is no winter maintenance on any of our trails. Please be safe when visiting.

The LRCA conducts snow surveys on a bimonthly basis on the 1st and 15th of the month between November and May of each year. There are three historical snow survey locations which are located at Hazelwood Lake Conservation Area (Current River), Madeline Street (McVicar Creek), and Vibert Road (Pennock Creek). Snow depth and weight (water content) are collected and forwarded to the MNRF's Surface Water Monitoring Centre as part of the Flood Forecasting Program. The January 16, 2023, snow surveys indicate that the snow survey locations are above average for snow depth and water content, when compared to the historical averages for January 15. The snow depth results were: McVicar Creek - 35.4 centimetres (cm) (16% above average), Pennock Creek - 41.8 cm (24% above average), and Current River – 48 cm (10% above average). The water content results were also above average for all three snow courses, with an equivalent water content ranging from 121 millimetres (mm) at McVicar Creek, 103.9 mm at Pennock Creek and 115.6 mm at Hazelwood (Current River). The next snow survey measurements will be taken on February 1, 2023. Please be advised that a "pay and display" unit will be installed at Silver Harbour Conservation Area during 2023, which will replace the coin box at that location. Vehicles parked at Silver Harbour (including vehicles utilizing the boat launch facility) will be required to display a slip from the Pay and Display unit or have a valid Explore Card Parking Pass displayed. All revenue generated through day use parking fees and Explore Card sales is used for Conservation Area upkeep and maintenance (including boat launch facilities) and staff costs. Non-compliance is subject to fines under Regulation 113: Conservation Areas – Lakehead Region. The 2023 Explore Card Parking Pass is available now, which provides parking at our Conservation Areas for one calendar year at a cost of only \$40.00 +HST instead of the \$5.00 per vehicle day use parking fee. 

CHERRY BREAD

(with Maraschino Cherry Glaze)

Recipe by Lizzy T (can be found on Pinterest)
Submitted by Erin Laforest

Ingredients

- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 jars maraschino cherries (10 oz jars), drained (reserve juice)
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup milk (2%)
- 1/2 cup canola oil
 - (or vegetable or melted coconut oil)
- 1 large egg
- 1 tsp almond extract (or vanilla)

Glaze

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 Tbsp melted butter
- 2 1/2 Tbsp maraschino cherry juice
- 1/2 tsp almond extract

Directions

Preheat the oven to 350F. Spray a loaf pan (9"x5") with cooking spray, or grease with shortening, then dust with flour. In a medium bowl, stir together the sugar, milk, oil, egg, and almond extract. In a separate bowl, combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Add the dry ingredients and stir until just combined. Coarsely chop the cherries in a food processor or with a knife. Gently fold cherries into batter. Pour batter into pan and bake for 50-55 minutes. An inserted toothpick should come out clean. Allow to cool for 10 minutes and remove to cool completely on a wire rack.

To make the glaze, combine the powdered sugar, melted butter, cherry juice and almond extract in a small bowl and whisk until it is smooth.


Once the bread is cool, spread the glaze on top of the bread. Do not spread the glaze while the loaf is still hot. Slice and serve. Store at room temp.
