By-law Number 2016-12, being a by-law respecting Construction, Demolition, Inspections, and to set out the rates for permits within the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor states that building permits will be required for the construction, erection, alteration, repair, removal, relocation and change of use of all buildings, decks or structures within the Township of O'Connor. If you are building anything larger than 161.2 square feet or any building with heating and/or plumbing, you are required to apply for a building permit. ## THE 7TH GLOBAL RECYCLING DAY MARCH 18, 2024

This directly affects humanity with increased poverty, immigration from displaced communities, job losses, waste mountains and natural habitats disappearing. We have the power to make lasting changes to combat this, and with recycling being recognized in the UN's Sustainable Development Goals 2030, we are already seeing many individuals, governments and organizations taking direct action to support the global green agenda. Recycling is a key part of the circular economy, helping to protect our natural resources. Each year the 'Seventh Resource' (recyclables) saves over 700 million tonnes in CO2 emissions and this is projected to increase to 1 billion tons by 2030. There is no doubt recycling is on the front line in the war to save the future of our planet and humanity.

The Global Recycling Foundation is pleased to announce the theme of Global Recycling Day 2024 as #RecyclingHeroes. This will recognize the people, places and activities that showcase what an important role recycling plays in contributing to an environmentally stable planet and a greener future which will benefit all. Global Recycling Day was created in 2018 to help recognize and celebrate the importance recycling plays in preserving our precious primary resources and securing the future of our planet. It is a day for the world to come together and put the planet first.

### **FIRE SAFETY CHECKLIST**

- Test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors monthly to make sure they are in good working order.
- \* Keep salt on hand to prevent falls on your driveway/ steps/walkway.
- \* Make sure fire extinguishers are properly stored, easily accessible, charged and undamaged. Also make sure everyone in your household knows how and when to use it.
- \* Keep your fire numbers visible from the road.
- Review your Home Fire Escape Plan with the family, and talk to your neighbours to see how you can support one another in the event of an emergency.

### WHAT IS EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND WHY DO WE STRESS IT SO MUCH?

Emergencies can happen at any time and without warning. Be ready. With a little preparation, you can respond quickly to help yourself and others. Understand the risks in your area, create a household emergency plan and build an emergency kit.

We stress these things on a monthly basis because in an emergency, you will need to be prepared for the unknown. We do this through training our emergency volunteers and staff, promoting education in our newsletters, filling out Township Emergency Forms for each household and making available an Emergency Text Messaging system to notify our residents of inclement weather, road closures and evacuations in our area.


In an emergency, you will need some basic supplies. You may need to get by without power or tap water. You need to be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours.

You may have some of the items already in your home or garage, such as food, water and a battery operated or wind-up flashlight. The key is to make sure these items are organized and easy to find. Would you be able to find your flashlight in the dark? Make sure your kit is easy to carry and everyone in the household knows where it is. Keep it in a

backpack, duffle bag or suitcase with wheels, in an easy-to-reach, accessible place, such as your front-hall closet. If you have many people in your household, your emergency kit could get heavy. It's a good idea to separate some of these supplies in backpacks. That way, your kit will be more portable and each person can personalize his or her own grab-and-go emergency kit. These are the actions we take to be prepared. The Township mitigates emergencies by taking efforts to eliminate or reduce the impacts and risks of hazards through proactive measures. These measures are taken before an emergency or disaster occurs. For example, cutting back forestation away from buildings so that should a wildfire start, buildings have a better chance to not start on fire.

The Township takes both preparation and mitigation measures to protect the Township so should an emergency occur, we are prepared to respond and take action to save lives, property and our environment.

Do your part, prepare yourself. Call the Township Office to learn how to sign up for emergency text messages or for information on emergency preparedness.



## SLOW COOKER PULLED PORK

Submitted by Teri Treftlin

## Ingredients

3 1/2 lbs pork shoulder roast

3/4 tsp each salt and pepper

2 Tbsp (25 ml) canola oil

2 onions, diced

4 cloves garlic, minced

4 Tbsp (50 ml) rye whiskey

2 tsp mustard seeds

2 Tbsp chili powder

2 tsp ground coriander

1/2 tsp cinnamon or big piece of cinnamon bark

2 bay leaves

1/4 cup (50 ml) tomato paste

1 can (14 oz/398 ml) tomato sauce

2 Tbsp packed brown sugar

2 Tbsp (25 ml) each cider vinegar and Worcestershire sauce

2 green onions, thinly sliced

Buns, pickled jalapeno peppers, shredded cheddar cheese and light sour cream for serving pork on.

### Preparation

Sprinkle pork with salt and pepper. In Dutch oven, heat oil over med-hi heat and brown pork all over. Transfer to slow cooker. Add onions, garlic, chili powder, coriander, and bay leaves to Dutch oven; fry and stir occasionally until onions are softened (about 5 min). Add tomato paste; cook and stir until darkened (about 2 min). Add whiskey, tomato sauce, sugar, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce, cinnamon & mustard seeds, scraping up any brown bits from pan. Pour into slow cooker. Cover & cook on low until pork is tender (min 8 hrs). Transfer pork to cutting board & tent with foil; let stand (about 10 min). With two forks, shred pork. Next, pour liquid from slow cooker into large saucepan. Skim fat (optional). Boil vigorously over high heat until reduced (about 15 min). Discard bay leaves & cinnamon bark. Add pork, reduce heat and simmer until hot (about 4 min). Sprinkle with green onions.



LRCA staff have continued to conduct bi-monthly snow surveys at the three historical snow survey locations (Hazelwood Lake, Vibert Road and Madeline Street). As of February 15<sup>th</sup>, snow depth and water content continued to be well below average for that time of year with depth ranging from 14.6-15.8 centimetres (65 % below average) and water content ranging from 44.8-46.6 millimetres (50% below average). Lake Superior's beginning of February level was 2 centimetres below the beginning of February average and 21 centimetres lower than the level last year. The Level II Low Water Condition remains in effect for the LRCA Area of Jurisdiction.

MNRF's snow monitoring data is now available to the public through the Ontario GeoHub. The site contains information including a list of all active and historical snow survey locations, mapping of snow survey locations as well as historic and current snow survey data (1933 - 2023).




