FIRE PERMITS

Fire Permits required between Apr. 1st and Oct. 31st.

- Fire Permits are required for ALL outdoor burning, including fireworks and incinerators, with the exception of small campfires for cooking or warmth,
- Permits may be revoked at any time at the absolute discretion of the Township's Fire Chief Greg Biloski,
- Fire Permits are now valid for the entire fire season and can be obtained online through the following steps below:

STEP 1: Register online at: https://oconnor.burnpermits.com/ (Keep your password). If you are already registered, please skip to Step 2 to log in. STEP 2: Using the same login information from previous years, follow the steps at the above web address to apply for your burn permit. STEP 3: Call 1-833-490-0299 each time before you burn. Calling this number before you burn is mandatory to ensure the Township is aware of all active burns, while providing you with the necessary risk level information.

If you are unable to register online for your yearly fire permit, you may call the Township Office at 807-476-1451 and staff will help get you registered so that each time you burn, you need only call the number in Step 3 above.

Please note that the Building Fees have changed. If you are building anything larger than 161.2 square feet or any building with heating and/or plumbing, you are required to apply for a building permit. ARE YOU READY FOR WILDFIRE SEASON

THIS YEAR WILL BE PARTICULARLY DRY

FOLLOW THESE WILDFIRE PREVENTION TIPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF



Check the weather system for high winds before creating an outdoor fire.

Completely extinguish any outdoor fire you create with water and dirt.




Never leave any fire unattended.



Don't throw cigarettes or other smoking materials or matches on the ground or out of vehicles.




Be mindful when operating equipment outdoors that can create heat or sparks.





Check for local bans or ordinances before you burn.





Make sure burn barrels are metal, in good condition, properly vented, and have a metal top screen.



Stay with your fire until out, drown with water, turn over ashes with shovel, repeat several times, and check site regularly over several days.



Choose a burn site surrounded by gravel or dirt that has 3x the height of the pile for vertical clearance from tree limbs and structures.



Keep your yard and surrounding property clear of debris. Use flame resistant yard material like rock or flame resistant plants.



Store flammable materials appropriately. Clear property of dying trees and plants. Trim any overgrown grass or shrubs.



Work with the community to remove dead or dying trees. Clear brush from grounds. Prune trees 10 feet up from the ground.



When building or retrofitting, use non-combustible roofing like asphalt shingles, metal, slate or clay tile and concrete products. Avoid wood or shake shingles.



Choose fire resistant materials for your home like brick, cement or stucco. Tempered and double pane windows can also make a home more resistant to wildfire heat.



Create a defensible space around the area of your home. Reduce fuel ignition sources like trees, shrubbery or fencing. These items, close to your home, can be a fire hazard.



Have an emergency plan should you need to evacuate your home due to wildfire.

Power Outage Safety



Power outages can happen at any time.

Whether you're without power for
minutes, hours, or days

— stay safe with the tips below!

Keep your **emergency preparedness kit** stocked.

Make sure you have portable sources of light
(flashlights, candles, glow sticks), extra batteries, and
non-perishable foods and lots of potable water.





There may be downed/live power lines in your area. Keep yourself and others at least 10 metres away (about the length of a school bus). Be careful: even wires that have been down for several days could still be live.

Stay **food safe**! Keep refrigerator doors closed during outages to preserve food. **Never** use charcoal or gas barbeques, camping stoves, or generators indoors.





Know when to go. If your home gets too cold or too hot and you are able to leave, head to an alternative location until it is safe to return. Take all household members (including pets) with you.

EARTH DAY 2024

Spring is on its way and what better way to think about what you can do to help the earth on Earth Day than by getting that composter going for your garden. Globally, there is growing consensus that we need to take action to address food loss and waste. Food that is produced but not eaten ends up in landfills and creates methane, a powerful greenhouse gas.

When food is wasted, all the resources used to produce it are also wasted. By reducing food loss and waste in Canada, we can also reduce our greenhouse gas emissions.

There are many causes of food loss and waste. Some examples include:

- stocking too much food that spoils before it can be sold or eaten,
- storage or packaging that is not able to stop food spoilage or contamination,
- disposing food scraps in the garbage instead of collection bins for organic waste.

Ways of reducing your food waste:

- Reuse your leftovers. Throw stuff together for a nice stir-fry or casserole dish.
- Recycle your food waste by composting, turning your leftover fruit, vegetables and coffee grounds into soil for your all your growing needs.
- Prepare weekly meal plans to avoid and plan a list for the grocery store to avoid purchasing more food than you need.
- Choose paper or cardboard food packaging over
- If you have a bigger family, buy items in bulk and limit single use containers.
- Purchase reusable food containers and bags.
- Freeze your leftovers for another day, rather than throwing them away.

Please remember to sort your garbage items, recycling all necessary items and ensuring that your garbage bags do not contain glass or animal excrement/diapers. The glass can harm our workers when the truck compacts the bags and the excrement makes a mess of the compactor. If you are unsure where to put these items, please ask the Disposal Site Caretaker. There is a designated area for glass only, and bags containing excrement get deposited in the main pit.

WELL WATER SAFETY

Regular testing of your well is important to make sure your water is safe for you and your family to drink. Bacteria such as E. coli can contaminate your well making it unsafe to drink. The risk is higher if you have animals in the area – especially on



farms with livestock and other animals – but the bacteria can also occur naturally in the soil.

The Thunder Bay District Health Unit (TBDHU) recommends testing at least three times per year for a drilled well: once after the spring melt and two more times during the spring/ summer. If you have a dug well, you should test four times per year. You should also do additional testing after heavy rains or flooding on your property when there is a greater risk of surface water washing into your well (drilled or dug).

Water sample bottles can be picked up during regular business hours at the Township of O'Connor Township Office and dropped off at the Public Health Laboratory located at 336 South Syndicate Avenue.



CREAMY TACO SOUP

Ingredients

- 1 lb ground beef, turkey, or chicken
- 1 Tbsp oil of your choice
- 1 small onion, diced
- 2-3 cloves of garlic, minced
- 1 (10 oz) can diced tomatoes (undrained) or 1 large tomato, chopped
- 1 (8 oz) package cream cheese or 1 cup heavy cream
- 2 Tbsp taco seasoning

Salt and pepper to taste

1 small green bell pepper, diced (optional)

Directions

Add oil to a large pot over medium-high heat. Add meat, onion, and garlic and stir for 7-8 minutes or until meat is browned though. Add diced tomatoes, cream cheese, taco seasoning, and salt and pepper to the pot. Add bell pepper if desired. Stir for 4-5 minutes or until tomatoes are soft and tender and cream cheese is mixed through. Add in beef broth and reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer 15-20 minutes or until desired thickness is achieved. Serve in small soup bowls as is or add toppings of your choice, such as freshly sliced avocado, sour cream, shredded cheese, freshly minced cilantro, jalapeno, or a drizzle of lime.




