# **FIRE PERMITS**

Fire Permits required between April 1st and October 31st.

- Fire Permits are required for ALL outdoor burning, including fireworks and incinerators, with the exception of small campfires for cooking or warmth,
- Permits may be revoked at any time at the absolute discretion of the Township's Fire Chief, Henry Mattas,
- Fire Permits are now valid for the entire fire season and can be obtained online through the following steps below:

STEP 1: Register online at: https://oconnor.burnpermits.com/ If you have already registered a previous year, please skip to Step 2.

STEP 2: Using the same login information from previous years, follow the steps at the above web address to apply for your burn permit.

STEP 3: Call 1-833-490-0299 each time before burning. Calling this number before you burn is mandatory to ensure the Township is aware of all active burns, while providing you with necessary risk level information.

If you are unable to register online for your yearly fire permit, you may call the Township Office at 807-476-1451 and staff will help get you registered so that each time you burn, you need only call the number in Step 3 above.

# LOAD RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT (Half Loads)

Load restrictions have been applied to all Township of O'Connor roads starting Monday, April 3, 2023 and will continue during the period designated by the Township of O'Connor. The Township of O'Connor reserves the right to extend the load restrictions due to the weather and/or road conditions after the MTO has lifted their restrictions. MTO also placed load restrictions on Highways 595 & 588 effective April 2, 2023 at 11:59 pm.

**Building Permits:** 

By-law Number 2016-12, being a by-law respecting Construction, Demolition, Inspections, and to set out the rates for permits within the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor states that building permits will be required for the construction, erection, alteration, repair, removal, relocation and change of use of all buildings, decks or structures within the Township of O'Connor. If you are building anything larger than 161.2 square feet or any building with heating and/or plumbing, you are required to apply for a building permit. # **Provincial Day of Action on Litter**

The next Provincial Day of Action on Litter is May 9, 2023. There are actions we can all take to put litter in its proper place. You can do this by:

- Reducing waste: giving old products new life instead of throwing them away. For example, using old containers for storage or support second-hand clothing stores as opposed to buying new.
- **Diverting waste:** recycling or composting materials when and where possible to divert waste away from landfills. For example, by using your blue and green bins. When cleaning up litter, make sure you properly separate out recyclables.
- Preventing waste and litter: stopping waste before its created, and before it has the chance to become litter. For example, by choosing to buy goods with less packaging or by bringing a reusable cup to take-out establishments that accept them.
- Cleaning up litter: helping to keep your community clean by picking up and properly disposing of litter, or by organizing a community litter cleanup for others.
- Properly disposing of waste: making sure anything that does belong in the trash, is securely placed in garbage bins to help keep our neighbourhood clean.

### What you can do

Your actions matter. Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a TV for three hours.

Almost every plastic item we've made since the 1950s is still in our environment.

# Actions you can take:

- Donating gently used plastic toys and clothing instead of throwing them away.
- Using your own reusable dinnerware instead of disposable plastic or paper plates.
- Swapping your plastic water bottle or takeout coffee cup for a reusable one when you're on the go.
- Recycling materials instead of throwing them in the garbage.
- Using bins to properly dispose of waste, and when bins are full or you can't locate one, taking waste home with you for proper disposal.
- Organizing a community cleanup or taking a moment to cleanup litter when you see it.
- Adopting a local greenspace, sidewalk or shoreline to help keep it litter-free.
- Reporting litter hot spots and illegal dumping.

- \* Clear the gutters of any debris.
- \* Trim trees and bushes close to your house.
- \* Keep your fire number visible from the road.
- Clean and inspect your BBQ. Never cook with propane burners or BBQ's indoors.
- \* Store fuel and other combustibles safely.
- \* Visually inspect electrical cords and outlets.
- Have a qualified technician do a performance check on your air conditioner for proper maintenance.

Don't forget to test your smoke alarms monthly. Ensuring your smoke alarms are working properly.

# MTO Contact Information for Highway Maintenance

# MTO General Contact Toll Free 1-833-768-0293

If residents encounter non-urgent concerns with the condition of the highways, they can call and leave a message on the toll-free line that will be responded to directly by an MTO staff person who will dispatch the necessary staff to review and assess the situation. This inbox is monitored daily.

If residents encounter Highway Conditions or situations that are imminently dangerous to the travelling public, the OPP are always the best first call. Think of washouts, bridge damage or debris across the road. OPP connects directly with MTO's Traffic Operations Centre and will dispatch resources as needed while providing traffic control until the situation can be addressed.

# MTO Information on Brushing and Tree Removal

MTO regularly reviews area highways to develop annual work plans that includes clearing of trees as well as brushing. Pitch Creek trees have been addressed this season.

If the Township has areas of specific concerns, residents can provide the specific locations and the MTO will be able to review and add this work to upcoming work. Also note that the concerns with the guiderail at Cedar Creek at Highway 595 are being reviewed by MTO to determine if any alterations for improved drainage can be made.

# Every resident has a responsibility when it comes to emergency preparedness.

You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours during an emergency situation. It is important that you are prepared and understand your responsibilities during an emergency.

### SAFE HOME INSTRUCTIONS

- Post emergency contact numbers near all telephones. Teach children how and when to dial 9-1-1.
- Have a working carbon monoxide detector, smoke detector and fire extinguisher. If you live in an apartment, know where the fire alarms and fire exits are located.
- Everyone in your home should know where to find the fire extinguisher. All capable adults and older children should know how to use it.
- Identify the possible emergency situations in the community. Discuss how you will respond to each emergency.
- Create a Home Escape Plan. Identify two escape routes from each room, and two meeting places: one near your home, one outside of your neighbourhood.
- Prepare a 72-hour emergency kit. Keep the kit in an accessible location and make sure it's easy to carry. If necessary, pack your kit into two smaller, easier to carry bags
- Have a battery-powered or hand-crank radio available and listen to local radio stations for information and emergency instructions
- Locate and label shut-off switches. Know how to turn off your home's water, electricity and propane. Make large, easy-to-see signs for water and propane shut-offs as well as for the breaker panel or fuse box. Clearly label the on-off positions and show family members how to shut off these services.
- Identify local and out-of-area contacts for family members to call if separated
- Make arrangements for members of your family with special needs: children, elderly, disabled, medical illness, pets
- Take a Basic First Aid or CPR class
- Know your insurance. Make sure that you have adequate coverage to meet your needs (type of coverage, amount of coverage, hazards covered).
- Keep family records in a water and fireproof safe (passports, birth certificates, etc.)

# PREPARE AN EMERGENCY KIT

Emergencies and disasters can happen at any time. Utilities can be out, roads closed, and crucial supplies unavailable. While local, provincial and federal officials prepare for emergencies, individuals can plan to be prepared at home and at work. Everyone should be prepared to take care of themselves and their families for up to three days in the event of an emergency or disaster by preparing a basic emergency kit, including additional needed supplies for extra comfort, and individual kit needs for babies & children, pets, elderly, and persons with disabilities or medical needs. In the event of needing to evacuate, having an emergency car survival kit is also beneficial.
