LOAD RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT

Load restrictions (half loads) have been applied to all Township of O'Connor roads effectiive Monday, April 3, 2023 and will continue during the period designated by the Township of O'Connor. The Township of O'Connor reserves the right to extend the load restrictions due to the weather and/or road conditions after the MTO has lifted their restrictions. MTO also has load restrictions on Highways 595 & 588.

DISPOSAL SITE

Blue Box Program Transition to Producer Responsibility

Ontario is transitioning the current Blue Box Program to a producer responsibility model. The new model means transitioning costs of the Blue Box Program away from municipal taxpayers and making producers of products and packaging fully responsible for the litter they create. The model will improve recycling across the province by:

- addressing the serious problem of plastic pollution and litter,
- expanding collection to all communities outside the Far North by 2026,
- standardizing what can be recycled across Ontario,
- accepting common single-use and packaging-like products such as paper and plastic cups, foils, trays, bags, and boxes sold for home use, and
- collecting single-use items that are distributed or sold to consume food and beverage products, like stir sticks, straws, cutlery and plates.

The Township of O'Connor will start to transfer responsibility to producers **starting January 1, 2024**. By December 31, 2025, producers will be fully responsible for providing blue box services across Ontario.

Taking the cost burden off municipalities and allowing producers to innovate

The cost of the current Blue Box system is not sustainable and is expected to increase significantly in the coming years.

The new regulation shifts the cost of operating the current system from municipalities to the producers who create the product and packaging waste. At the same time, we are giving producers the tools to find efficiencies and lower costs. This will:

- allow producers to find cost efficiencies to improve the collection and management of materials ,
- encourage producers to make packaging that is easier to recycle, and
- put valuable materials back into the economy.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION FORMS

Have you filled out or updated your Emergency Information Form? These forms are so important to have on file at the Township Office for your safety, in the event of an emergency. As a small community, staff are always concerned of our residents' well-being. These forms give staff the information they need to ensure that your needs are met during an emergency or in the event of an emergency evacuation. It also lets staff know if you are willing to give a helping hand to your community in the event of an emergency. All information is kept confidential and used only in the event of an emergency. Find the Emergency Information Form on the Township's website under "O'Connor Living", "Emergency Services." Email or drop off completed forms to the Township Office during regular office hours or drop in an envelope through our mail slot located on the office front door.

PUBLIC INFORMATION GUIDE: SEVERE WINDSTORMS OR TORNADO

WEATHER WATCHES AND WARNINGS:

Environment Canada issues weather watches and warnings when anticipated weather poses a threat to public safety. This information is relayed to the public by radio and television.

A severe weather **watch** is issued up to six hours in advance to alert the public that for a specified portion of Ontario there is a high potential for dangerous thunderstorm weather, which may be accompanied by severe windstorms or a tornado.

A severe weather **warning** is issued to alert the public that severe thunderstorms or tornadoes are imminent in the warning area – i.e., a severe thunderstorm is in progress or expected to occur within two hours.

SEVERE WINDSTORM AND TORNADO SAFETY HINTS:

A personal severe windstorm or tornado awareness program should include:

- being aware of the weather, and knowing the radio or television stations which broadcast up-to-the-minute weather information,
- knowing the name by which Environment Canada refers to your forecast region when they issue weather watches and warnings,
- reviewing your plans of action.

WHEN A SEVERE WINDSTORM OR TORNADO THREATENS:

a) Stay away from your windows, doors, and outside walls. Protect your head.

b) For maximum safety, go down to the basement or seek shelter under a stairway or sturdy table, or in a closet.

c) Try to reach the centre of the house or the side away from the storm.

d) Avoid buildings with large areas of unsupported roof, including arenas, barns or supermarkets.

e) If caught in the open, try to determine the tornado's direction of travel and move at right angles to it. If you cannot avoid the storm, find a ditch, ravine, or other depression, and lie flat. Do not remain in your car. Many people have been killed trying to ride out a tornado in their car.

f) If no shelter can be found, hang on to the base of a small tree or shrub.

g) Remember that damaged and weakened structures, fallen debris, downed hydro wires, and gas leaks are potential dangers after a storm has passed.

HAVE AN EMERGENCY EVACUATION PLAN

Local authorities issue evacuation alerts and orders when disasters threaten. Residents are encouraged to listen to local radio and television reports and if local authorities ask you to leave, do so immediately. The amount of time you have, to evacuate, will depend on the disaster. When you are ordered to evacuate is not the time to decide what to do and what to take. Making an Evacuation Plan for you and your family will relieve some of the stress you might experience when being ordered to evacuate.

EVACUATION ALERT

If the disaster is not imminent and you have been placed on "alert", do the following:

- Bring items indoors (lawn furniture, trash cans, children's toys, garden equipment, etc),
- · Look for potential hazards around your home,
- Turn off electricity and water,
- Turn off propane gas,
- If high winds are expected, cover the outside of all windows of your home,

• If flooding is expected, consider using sandbags to keep your residence safe and dry.

If you are issued an Evacuation Order, use specified travel routes. Do not use shortcuts – they may be impassible. Be alert for unsafe roads and bridges. Do not drive into flooded areas. Stay away from downed power lines. Stay out of fire hazard areas until you are advised it is safe to return. Follow return instructions issued by the local authority.

CORNERSTONE HISTORY

In memory of the late Karen Byers, the Council & Staff of the Township of O'Connor would like to acknowledge that the "O'Connor Cornerstone" newsletter was first started, produced and named by Karen. In the O'Connor Township History Book, Karen had stated that in the making of the history book, she found some of the earliest newsletters. The earliest she had found was from 1981, but that the issues had begun before that. Eventually, the newsletter was taken over by the Township.

Aging and Health Series Results!

Thank you to everyone who came out to participate, speak, or volunteer at the Aging and Health Series during the month of March!

We had residents from Thunder Bay, Oliver Paipoonge, Kakabeka Falls, Gillies, O'Connor, Atikokan, Kaministiquia and Conmee in attendance!

The overall project, which was 100% funded by the Province of Ontario, cost \$10,233.46.

- 10 sessions were held
- 20 topics were covered
- 20 partnerships formed as a result
- A total of 133 people attended
- October had 1.5x more attendees than September and March had 3x more attendees than October! Each time we did this, the attendance grew!
- We exceeded our expected "web-based metrics" over 500 reactions
- 64 surveys were returned:
 - 92% said they would be interested in attending something like this again
 - 99% felt the project helped them network and participate in the community
 - 99% felt the project helped increase their safety and wellbeing

To recognize our efforts and demonstrate commitment to legislation set out by the Ministry of Seniors and Accessibility, we submitted an application for AMCTO's E.A. Danby Award (Learn more here: https://www.amcto.com/About/Awards/E-A-Danby-Award-Page). Conmee is the successful recipient of the award in the category of "Implementation of Legislation"!

The Award will be presented at the AMCTO Conference in Niagara Falls on Tuesday June 13th. Stay tuned for more seminar opportunities as the Township plans to do something like this again in the future!
