2023 FINAL TAX BILLING

FIRE PERMITS - Please Note the Fire Ban currently in place. Watch our website for updates.

Fire Permits required between April 1st and October 31st.

- Fire Permits are required for ALL outdoor burning, including fireworks and incinerators, with the exception of small campfires for cooking or warmth.
- Permits may be revoked at any time at the absolute discretion of the Township's Fire Chief, Henry Mattas.
- Fire Permits are now valid for the entire fire season and can be obtained online through the following steps below:

STEP 1: Register online at: https://oconnor.burnpermits.com/ If you have already registered a previous year, please skip to Step 2.

STEP 2: Using the same login information from previous years, follow the steps at the above web address to apply for your burn permit.

STEP 3: Call 1-833-490-0299 each time before burning. Calling this number before you burn is mandatory to ensure the Township is aware of all active burns, while providing you with necessary risk level information.

If you are unable to register online for your yearly fire permit, you may call the Township Office at 807-476-1451 and staff will help get you registered so that each time you burn, you need only call the number in Step 3 above.

By-law Number 2016-12, being a by-law respecting Construction, Demolition, Inspections, and to set out the rates for permits within the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor states that building permits will be required for the construction, erection, alteration, repair, removal, relocation and change of use of all buildings, decks or structures within the Township of O'Connor. If you are building anything larger than 161.2 square feet or any building with heating and/or plumbing, you are required to apply for a building permit. DISPOSAL SITE

COMPOSTING

If you haven't been throwing your food scraps into the composter all winter, then now's the time to get those goodies in your compost pile to start cooking in the summer heat. Composting is not only beneficial for our gardens, but it also keeps the extra waste out of our Disposal Site. Compost is a mixture of ingredients used as plant fertilizer and to improve soil's physical, chemical, and biological properties. Composting is a process by which plant and food waste, organic materials, and manure decomposes into soil. It's a great way to recycle scraps from your yard and kitchen.

WHAT TO COMPOST

- fruit & vegetable peels and scraps
- rotten fruit and veggies
- houseplant trimmings
- coffee grounds and paper filters
- tea leaves
- nutshells (apart from walnuts)
- paper, cardboard, and shredded newspaper
- napkins, paper towels. and unused toilet paper
- grass clippings, leaves
- flowers
- sawdust, wood chips
- hair and fur
 - eggshells
- * Do not compost food that will attract animals and pests (bones or meat scraps, dairy, baked goods, fat, oil or grease), pet waste or feces, plastic, pesticide treated lawn trimmings, charcoal, diseased or infected plants, or large pieces of wood that are too difficult to break down.

STEPS TO COMPOSTING

- 1. Determine where you want your compost heap or bin. Select an outdoor location with partial shade and plenty of drainage. It's also important to pick an area that's easily accessible but removed from animals, including pets and wildlife. Your pile should be at least 3 feet in width and height, which is a manageable size for most gardeners and ensures that it can retain heat.
- 2. Now start adding materials. It's generally recommended to alternate green and brown materials in layers. The term 'green materials" refers to items like food and yard scraps, while "brown materials" include carbon-rich items like branches, paper, straw, and wood chips. Although lavering isn't required, it helps ensure that you're maintaining the right balance of green and brown materials to optimize the decomposition process. Start by creating a 4" - 8" layer of bulky brown materials, such as twigs, at the bottom of your pile to provide aeration and drainage. Then, alternate layers of green and brown materials until your bin is full. Be sure to add a bit of water to each layer to keep it moist.
- 3. You should turn your pile regularly to ensure efficient composting. Use a shovel or pitchfork to turn and rotate the materials to distribute air and moisture evenly. How often you need to turn your compost depends on many factors, including the size of the pile, amount of moisture, and ratio of brown to green materials. Generally, you should start by turning your pile every 4-7 days. As your compost starts to mature, you may need to turn it less often. While most of the moisture in your compost pile should come from rain, you may need to water it occasionally to help keep it moist. If the pile becomes soggy, you can add extra brown materials or turn it more frequently to remove excess moisture.

It can take anywhere from a few weeks to a year for your materials to fully decompose, depending on the size of your pile, type of materials used, moisture levels, and climate. When it's ready to use, your compost should appear dark brown and crumbly, similar to soil. It should also have a rich, earthy smell and be free of any large chunks of material.

SUMMER FIRE SAFETY CHECKLIST

- Practice safe grilling.
- * Burn safely. Know the risk level in your area.
- * Be aware of wildfires in the area.
- Keep your fire number visible from the road.
- Have your HVAC system maintained.
- Closely supervise all fires and campfires.
- * Douse hot coals with plenty of water.
- Let your lawnmower cool down before fueling up. Don't forget to test your smoke alarms monthly. Ensuring your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors are functioning properly could save your life.

FIREWORKS SAFETY


PLEASE NOTE: The Township has stated that NO fireworks are to be ignited during the fire ban. Any parties responsible for starting a fire with fireworks will be held liable for all costs.

Please check https://oconnor.burnpermits.com/ for the status of the fire ban before setting off any fireworks displays. Should the fire ban be lifted, ensure that you have a burn permit for your fireworks and call it in so that the Volunteer Fire Department is aware that you will be igniting fireworks.

SAFETY TIPS

- 1. Do not smoke or allow flames near fireworks.
- 2. Choose a wide, clear site for firing, away from overhead obstacles and dry grass. Keep your audience at least 100 meters back from the lighting area.
- Prior to use, store fireworks in a cool, dry place. Use caution when positioning fireworks, preventing accidental product damage from dew and ground level moisture.
- 4. Read the instructions on each item. Different items have different firing instructions.
- Check the wind direction and angle your fireworks away from spectators about 10 degrees off of center. Do not shoot fireworks in high winds.
- Do not shoot fireworks out of glass or metal containers.
 These could crack or explode, sending shards of material outward.
- Never attempt to re-light a misfired fireworks item.
 Keep a bucket of water or hose nearby to extinguish such items. If an item does not light easily, or fizzles out, do not approach the item for 20 minutes.
- Do not shoot fireworks under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Sparklers are the only fireworks item designed to be held in the hand.
- 10. Do not transport fireworks in your pockets.
- 11. The shooter and his/her assistants should wear snug fitting, cotton clothing, a cotton baseball hat, cotton gloves, safety goggles, and hearing protection to ensure the safe ignition of a fireworks display.
- 12. Keep pets indoors while shooting fireworks.

Remember, fireworks are fun, but treat them with respect!

Evacuation & Shelter-In-Place

An evacuation may be ordered when there is a significant threat. Other times, it may be safer to remain inside (shelter-in-place). These orders are typically broadcast through TV, radio, government websites, social media or wireless public alerting.

- Evacuate only when ordered by emergency officials and if safety permits, take your pets.
- Take your emergency kit with you and head to your designated meeting place or reception centre.

Shelter-in-Place

- Close and lock all windows and exterior doors.
- Turn off all fans, heating and air-conditioning systems to avoid drawing air in from the outside.

Household Emergency Plan

- Create an emergency plan and discuss potential emergency situations ahead of time to reduce fear and anxiety.
- Review your plan yearly and practice going to your meeting

Meeting Places

Identify two meeting places in case you have to leave your home or can't return home right away:

- Near your home.
- Outside of your neighbourhood.

Prevent the bite

- ⇒ Cover up as much skin as possible
- ⇒ Use bug spray with Icaridin or DEET on exposed skin
- ⇒ Check yourself and your pets before heading inside

Remove the tick

- ⇒ Use fine-tipped tweezers to grab as close to the skin as possible
- ⇒ Pull up slowly, don't twist or turn
- ⇒ Wash with soap OR apply rubbing alcohol
- ⇒ Monitor for unusual symptoms; see a health care provider if concerned

Submit the tick

⇒ Place in a clean container and submit to the Health Unit





SPINACH DIP

INGREDIENTS

2 x 8 oz Cream Cheese (softened)
1/2 cup Mayonnaise
1 cup Cheddar Cheese (grated)
10 oz frozen, chopped Spinach (thawed and squeezed dry)
6 slices (1/2 cup) Bacon (chopped and fried)
1/4 cup Onion (finely chopped)
2 tsp Dill Weed
1/4 tsp Garlic Powder or 1 Clove Minced

DIRECTIONS

Beat cream cheese and mayonnaise together until smooth. Stir in next 6 ingredients. Can be baked in an oven proof bowl or in a pumpernickel loaf. If using a bowl, cover with tinfoil during heating. If using a loaf, cut the top off the loaf and hollow out the loaf leaving a 1" thick shell. Reserve removed bread for dipping. Pour spinach mixture into hollow. Heat in 325F oven for 2 hours. Remove from oven and remove foil. Makes 3 cups of dip or 1 loaf. Serve warm with leftover bread or plain nacho chips.


