THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF O'CONNOR BY-LAW NUMBER 2019 - 15

Being a By-law for decreasing the speed of motor vehicles from statutory speed limits.

WHEREAS subsection 128 (2) of the HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT, R.S.O. 1990, c.H.8 states that the Council of the municipality may, for vehicles driven on a highway or portion of a highway under its jurisdiction, by by-law prescribe a rate of speed different from the rate set out in subsection (1) that is not greater than 100 kilometres per hour and may prescribe different rates of speed for different times of day;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the speed of motor vehicles on certain highways in the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor be restricted;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor enacts as follows:



1. When any highway or portion of highway set out below is marked in compliance with the regulations under the HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT, the maximum rate of speed thereon shall be as follows:

Highway	From	To
a) CRONK ROAD	Highway 595	Marks Townline
60 kilometres per hour		

2. The penalties provided in subsection 128 (14) of the HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT shall apply to offences against this by-law.

3. This by-law shall come into force and take effect October 1, 2019.

Building Permits:

By-law Number 2016-12, passed June 27, 2016, being a by-law respecting Construction, Demolition, Inspections, and to set out the rates for permits within the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor states that building permits will be required for the construction, erection, alteration, repair, removal, relocation and change of use of all buildings or structures within the Township of O'Connor. If you are building anything larger than 108 square feet or a building with heating, you are required to apply for a building permit. 

**WASTE REDUCTION WEEK
Oct. 21 – 27, 2019**

Waste Reduction Week in Canada is a year-round program, focused solely on the principles of circular economy, resource efficiency, and waste reduction. The program's primary purpose is to celebrate our environmental efforts and achievements while encouraging new innovative ideas and solutions. The celebratory nature of the campaign is how it motivates learning and behavior change.

The program's educational resources and "take action" messaging empower all Canadians to adopt more environmentally conscious choices. Waste Reduction Week in Canada further provides information and ideas to reduce waste in all facets of daily living, creating the solutions to the many environmental challenges we face including climate change, water pollution and preservation of natural resources.

In the spirit of making this a successful waste reduction week, the Township of O'Connor would like to challenge its residents to take part and do their best to reduce their garbage as much as possible.

If we can reduce the amount of waste that is produced in the first instance, we are conserving resources and limiting the need to reuse or recycle. Canadians produce more than 31 million tonnes of waste annually¹, that's 2.7kgs per person per day. In perspective, that's the same volume of waste being generated as piling up 31 million average family cars. Nearly 40% of this waste is generated at home with the remainder coming from commercial, industrial, construction and demolition sources. Of the waste we are generating, we are diverting less than 25%. Start practicing the 3Rs in everyday life. Whether you are at home, at school or at work, think about how you can reduce, reuse or recycle your waste to turn it into a resource. All of us have an important role to play in reducing waste. Tips for a Fire-Safe Halloween

- Test your smoke alarms to make sure they work. In case a fire starts in your home, you need to know right away. This is also a great time to buy fresh batteries for your home smoke alarms.
- Choose safer alternatives for lighting like battery operated candles, flashlights, and glow sticks instead of candles in carved pumpkins and other Halloween decorations.
- Purchase or make Halloween costumes (including wigs and props) labeled flame-resistant or flame-retardant. Choose materials that won't easily ignite and avoid billowing or long-trailing features.
- Keep dried flowers, cornstalks and other decorations away from all open flames and heat sources, including light bulbs and heaters.
- Remember to keep exits clear of decorations, to ensure nothing blocks your escape routes in the event of a fire.
- If hosting a party for the "ghosts and goblins" in your home, be sure that everyone knows your home escape plan in the event of a fire, and a meeting place outside your home.
- If your children are going to Halloween parties at others' homes, have them ask the host about their home escape plan so they can plan how to get out safely in an emergency.
- Make sure that children know to "stop, drop and roll" if their clothing does catch fire. (Stop immediately, drop to the ground, covering your face with your hands, and roll over and over to extinguish flames.)
- Provide children with lightweight battery-operated flashlights or glow sticks to carry for lighting or as part of their costume.
- Extension cords are for temporary use only. Use the right one for the job -- there are special extension cords rated for outdoor use.
- Never overload electrical outlets by plugging in too many plugs -- use an approved power bar.
- If you must use candles, never leave them unattended and keep them well away from children, pets, and anything that can burn.
- Teach children their home address and phone number and how to call 9-1-1 (or their local emergency number) in case of an emergency. Contact your local fire department or visit www.ontario.ca/fire_marshall for more information about protecting your family from fire year-round.

FIRE PERMITS

REQUIRED FOR ALL BURNING APRIL 1 - OCTOBER 31

Fire permits are required during the fire season which runs from April 1st to October 31st as per the Forest Fire Prevention Act. A permit is required before starting a fire outdoors; including the burning of grass, brush and the use of Incinerators.

Please note burning is allowed 2 hours before sunset until 2 hours after sunrise.

Fire permits are valid for 15 days and an incinerator permit is valid for the entire fire season. Permits may be revoked at anytime at the absolute discretion of the Township's Fire Chief Henry Mattas.

**Small fires for cooking or warmth
DO NOT require a fire permit.**



WATER TESTING

Regular testing of your private well is important to make sure your water is safe for you and your family to drink. Bacteria such as E. coli can contaminate your well making it unsafe to drink. The risk is higher if you have animals in the area – especially on farms with livestock and other animals – but the bacteria can also occur naturally in the soil.



How often should the water be tested?

- For testing, the TBDHU recommends:
- Drilled Well - at least three times per year; once after the spring melt and then summer and fall
 - Dug Well - at least four times per year; one after the spring melt, and three more times during the summer and fall
- Heavy rainfalls or flooding? Additional testing is recommended as there is a greater risk of surface water washing into your well (drilled or dug).

Excerpt from the OPP Monthly Newsletter



DISTRACTED DRIVING

Distracted driving refers to all forms of distracted or inattentive driving such as adjusting a vehicle's entertainment, GPS unit, or stereo, eating and drinking, using a hand-held device, self-grooming or tending to children in the backseat, etc. Drivers need to remember that the true danger to public safety lies in the distraction, not the device.

Distracted driving continues to be a serious issue on our roads. The distracted driving legislation came into effect in October 2009. As of January 1, 2019 the new set fines for distracted driving have been increased. (See below for details).

The OPP continues to focus on safety for everyone using the roadways. Be safe and make good decisions to ensure you arrive home safely to your family.

The following information is provided from the province of Ontario regarding the set fines for Distracted Driving:

Drivers with A to G licences

If you have an A, B, C, D, E, F, G and/or M licence, you'll face bigger penalties when convicted of distracted driving.

First conviction:

- a fine of \$615, if settled out of court (includes a victim surcharge and the court fee)
- a fine of up to \$1,000 if a summons is received or if you fight the ticket in court and lose
- three demerit points
- 3-day suspension

Second conviction:

- a fine of \$615, if settled out of court (includes a victim surcharge and the court fee)
- a fine of up to \$2,000 if a summons is received or if you fight the ticket in court and lose
- six demerit points 7-day suspension

Third and any further conviction(s):

- a fine of \$615, if settled out of court (includes a victim surcharge and the court fee)
- a fine of up to \$3,000 if a summons is received or if you fight the ticket in court and lose
- six demerit points
- 30-day suspension
- \$281 (2019) to reinstate suspended licence

Novice drivers

If you hold a G1, G2, M1 or M2 licence, and are convicted of distracted driving, you'll face the same fines as drivers with A to G licences. But you won't receive any demerit points.

Instead of demerit points you'll face longer suspensions:

- a 30-day licence suspension for a first conviction
- a 90-day licence suspension for a second conviction
- cancellation of your licence and removal from the Graduated Licensing System (GLS) for a third conviction
- to get your licence back you'd have to redo the GLS program


