Building Permits:

By-law Number 2016-12, being a by-law respecting Construction, Demolition, Inspections, and to set out the rates for permits within the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor states that building permits will be required for the construction, erection, alteration, repair, removal, relocation and change of use of all buildings, decks or structures within the Township of O'Connor. If you are building anything larger than 161.2 square feet or any building with heating and/or plumbing, you are required to apply for a building permit. FALL CLEAN UP TO DO LIST

Now is the time to get cleaning and decluttering before winter. Preparing for winter will make life easier when spring arrives. When disposing of your garbage or unwanted items, please keep in mind that not everything should be thrown to the Disposal Site. Use the following checklist to make your fall clean-up easy and enjoyable.

- Check out all Food Storage Go through your fridge, freezer and cabinets. Check for expired or unwanted food items. For items not expired, drop them off at the Township Office for the Rural Cupboard Food Bank and put items in the Community Blessing Box.
- Clean out the Closets Switch seasons and declutter your closets. Bag up any unwanted clothing, linens, etc and drop off at clothing bins or stores in various locations. Many places take used items. Even if they're not in good condition, they will cut them up for rags.
- 3. Clean up Yard Debris The most efficient way to start cleaning up the yard is at the top, by pruning trees, trimming hedges and cleaning gutters. After that, work your way down. Disposing of your branches and yard debris will give you a proper fall yard cleanup and put you ahead of the game when spring arrives.
- Clean out the basement Get rid of any junk and debris you've been storing and not doing anything with. This will help declutter and give you more space for the winter.

FIRE PERMITS

Fire Permits are still required until October 31st. If you need assistance applying for a permit, please contact Township Staff at 807-476-1451.

- Fire Permits are required for ALL outdoor burning, including fireworks and incinerators, with the exception of small campfires for cooking or warmth,
- Permits may be revoked at anytime at the absolute discretion of the Township's Fire Chief, Henry Mattas,
- Fire Permits are valid for the entire fire season and can be obtained through the following steps below:
- ⇒ **STEP 1:** Register online at: https://
 oconnor.burnpermits.com/ Keep your password for future years. If you have already registered a previous year, please skip to Step 2.
- ⇒ **STEP 2:** Using the same login information from previous years, follow the steps at the above web address to apply for your burn permit.
- ⇒ STEP 3: Call 1-833-490-0299 each time before burning. Calling this number before you burn is mandatory to ensure the Township is aware of all active burns, while providing you with the necessary risk level information.







Willis' Smothered Chicken

Submitted by Willis Mattas

6 chicken breasts

1 cup uncooked rice

1 cup mushroom soup

10 ounces water

1 package onion soup mix (you may want to use less to suit your taste)

Lay chicken breasts in a greased 9" x 13" dish with the skin side facing up. Sprinkle uncooked rice over the chicken breasts. Mix together soup and water. Pour the soup mixture over the chicken breasts and rice. Bake at 350F for one and a half hours.

Enjoy!!

Macaroni salad

(makes approx. 2 L and can be halved easily, similar to Odena's)

- 1.5 cups of uncooked macaroni... cook as directed to just slightly al dente (not too soft) Drain and cool.
- 2 -3 large celery sticks, chopped/diced fine
- 10 12 baby carrots, chopped/diced fine
- 2 3 green onion chopped/diced fine
- 10 12 heaping TBSP of Miracle Whip
- 4 TBSP sweet green relish
- 4 TBSP ketchup
- 1 TBSP mustard

Salt and pepper to taste – optional

Once cooled, add chopped/diced celery, carrots and onion to cooked macaroni. Add remaining ingredients.

(You can add a bit extra Miracle Whip or even a TBSP or two of mayonnaise to make it creamier if you like)

Refrigerate until ready to eat.

(I make the day before and let sit overnight to let the flavours blend)

Public Utility Locate Service

There is buried infrastructure all over Ontario. You must contact Ontario One Call to get buried cables, pipes, and wires located so you can dig safely.

Ontario One Call is a public safety administrative authority and the communication link between those wanting to dig and buried infrastructure owners who are required to provide locates.

Ontario One Call does not physically mark the lines, pipes, or cables. We relay the dig information to the buried infrastructure owners so they can mark (locate) based on the request you submit.

BEAR ENCOUNTERS

Not every bear sighting is an emergency situation. Here is who to call if you encounter a bear.

Emergency situations

Call 911 or your local police if a bear poses an immediate threat to personal safety and exhibits threatening or aggressive behaviour. Police will respond first to an emergency situation, but may request assistance from the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry.

Non-emergency encounters

Call the toll-free Bear Wise reporting line at 1-866-514-2327 or (TTY 705-945-7641) if a bear is not posing immediate threat, but rather being a continual nuisance. This line operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, from April 1st to November 30th.


