**Building Permits:** 

By-law Number 2016-12, being a by-law respecting Construction, Demolition, Inspections, and to set out the rates for permits within the Corporation of the Township of O'Connor states that building permits will be required for the construction, erection, alteration, repair, removal, relocation and change of use of all buildings, decks or structures within the Township of O'Connor. If you are building anything larger than 161.2 square feet or any building with heating and/or plumbing, you are required to apply for a building permit. # **Volunteer Fire Department News**

Since our last newsletter, the O'Connor Volunteer Fire Department received 0 Fire calls and 2 First Response calls.

This winter season please practice fire safety. For tips on keeping your house safe, please read below. For tips on Christmas fire safety, please see page 5 of this month's issue.

#### FIRE SAFETY CHECKLIST

- Make sure to have your furnace serviced,
- Make sure to your chimney has been swept,
- Make sure smoke alarms are installed on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas,
- Make sure fire extinguishers are properly stored, easily accessible, charged and undamaged. Also make sure everyone in your household knows how and when to use it,
- Keep your fire numbers visible from the road and driveways wide enough for emergency vehicles,
- Review your Home Fire Escape Plan with the family.

Don't forget to test your alarms monthly. Ensuring your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors are functioning properly could save your life!

As a small community, Staff and Council are always concerned for our residents' well-being. By filling out an Emergency Information Form, Staff will have the information they need to ensure that your needs are being met during an emergency or in the event of an emergency evacuation. All information is kept confidential and used only in the event of an emergency. Don't need help in an emergency, but want to help your community? This information is also on the form! # 12 Days of Christmas Fire Safety



- **DAY 1 -** Water fresh trees daily It's time to trim that Christmas tree, and if you're using a real tree, cut an inch from the base before setting up and keep the base of the trunk in water at all times. Keep your tree away from any ignition source such as the fireplace, heaters or candles.
- **DAY 2 -** Check all sets of lights before decorating Before you put those lights on the tree or around the front window check the cords closely. Discard any sets that are frayed or damaged.
- **DAY 3 -** Make sure you have working smoke alarms It's a great time to test and check your smoke alarms. Replace smoke alarms if they are over 10 years old. Remember that you need working smoke alarms on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas.
- **DAY 4 -** Make sure you have working carbon monoxide alarms Carbon monoxide is an invisible, odourless gas that can quickly kill you. Replace any carbon monoxide alarms over seven years old. Installing carbon monoxide alarms in your home will alert you to the presence of this deadly gas.
- **DAY 5 -** Make sure everyone knows your fire escape plan Develop and practice a home fire escape plan with all members of the household and make sure someone helps young children, older adults or anyone else that may need assistance to evacuate. Once outside, stay outside and call 911 from a cell phone or neighbours house.
- **DAY 6 -** Use extension cords wisely People often use extension cords for that extra set of lights or the dancing Santa in the corner. Extension cords should be used only as a temporary connection. Make sure cords never go under rugs as this can cause damage to the cord and cause a fire.
- **DAY 7 -** Give space heaters space If you are using space heaters to help take the chill off, remember to keep them at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn; curtains, furniture, or decorations.
- **DAY 8 -** When you go out, blow out! Candles can set the perfect mood for a holiday celebration, but remember to always blow out candles before leaving the room or going to bed. Keep lit candles safely away from children and pets and anything that can burn. Be safe!
- **DAY 9 -** Keep matches and lighters out of sight and reach of kids People often keep matches and lighters handy to light holiday candles. But matches and lighters can be deadly in the hands of children.
- **DAY 10 -** Watch what you heat! Cooking fires most commonly occur when cooking is left unattended. Always stay in the kitchen when cooking. If a pot catches fire, carefully slide a tight-fitting lid over the pot to smother the flames and then turn off the heat.
- **DAY 11 -** Encourage smokers to smoke outside Careless smoking is the leading cause of fatal fires. If you do allow smoking indoors use large, deep ashtrays that can't be knocked over and make sure cigarette butts are properly extinguished.
- **DAY 12 -** Drink Responsibly With all the festive cheer this time of year, keep a close eye on anyone attempting to smoke while under the influence of alcohol. Alcohol and smoking are all too often a common factor in many fatal fires.

# PREPARE AN EMERGENCY CAR WINTER CARE KIT

Always have winter safety and emergency equipment in your car. A basic car kit should contain the following:

- Food that won't spoil, such as energy bars
- Water plastic bottles that won't break if the water freezes (replace them every six months)
- Blanket
- Extra clothing and shoes or boots
- First aid kit with seatbelt cutter
- Small shovel, scraper and snowbrush
- Candle in a deep can and matches
- Wind-up flashlight
- Whistle in case you need to attract attention
- Roadmaps
- Copy of your emergency plan

#### Items to keep in your trunk:

- Sand, salt or cat litter (non-clumping)
- Antifreeze and windshield washer fluid
- Tow rope
- Jumper cables
- Fire extinguisher
- Warning light or road flares

## Christmas recycling

Not sure what you can recycle and what you need to throw out with the rest of the garbage? Read on for some helpful hints and maybe think of how you'll decorate your gifts this year.

Wrapping paper: While most paper can be included with your paper recyclables, wrapping paper, ribbons and bows are not. The traditional Christmas wrap has extremely high ink content, it contains things like plastic and glitter and it also has a really low fibre content and it's those things that mean it holds minimal value in the recycling process. Tissue paper used to wrap presents or fill gift bags can be included in your paper recycling.

Gift bags: Paper gift bags can be included with your paper recyclables. Be sure to remove handles, metal grommets and decorations such as bows and ribbons. Similar to wrapping paper, gift bags with foil lining or non-paper decoration are not recyclable as they are not compatible with the recycling process.

Greeting cards: Greeting cards should be included in your paper recycling, but if your card plays music or a recorded greeting be sure to remove the electronic circuitry and battery first.

Gift baskets: Neither cellophane wrap used with gift baskets, nor the basket itself are able to be recycled, but basket filler made from paper is okay to include in your

Packages: Cardboard boxes used for shipping gifts should be broken down so that they lay flat and bundled with other boxes before recycling. Bubble wrap and foam packing peanuts: These are not accepted in the recycling bins however, packaging paper is.

PLEASE NOTE that real Christmas trees (with items removed) may be disposed of in the clean wood section at the Disposal Site.

Disposal of any these products poses a threat to the environment if not handled correctly. At home, please keep hazardous waste in the original container with its label. Never mix hazardous wastes together.





# **VEGETABLE FRITTATA**

# Ingredients

- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1/2 cup chopped sweet red pepper
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 3 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 2 medium red potatoes, cooked and cubed
- 1 small zucchini, cubed
- 6 large eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- Pinch pepper

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat broiler. In a 10-in. cast-iron or ovenproof skillet, saute onion, peppers and garlic in 2 tablespoons of oil until the vegetables are tender. Remove vegetables with a slotted spoon; set aside.
- 2. In the same skillet over medium heat, lightly brown potatoes in remaining oil. Add vegetable mixture and zucchini; cook for 4 minutes.
- 3. In a bowl, beat eggs, salt and pepper; pour over vegetables. Cover and cook for 8-10 minutes or until eggs are nearly set. Broil 6 in. from the heat for 2 minutes or until eggs are set on top. Cut into wedges.




