### Admission

Daily event admission is \$12 for adults, \$10 for seniors, students and youth, and children five and under are free. The Park is offering a 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Season Pass; \$90 for a family (four people) and \$50 for an individual. All prices include HST. Admission is free for Indigenous Persons, military personnel and veterans.





Experience guided hikes and canoe tours with local experts, and public programming provided by Science North, Lakehead Region Conservation Authority, Royal Astronomical Society, and the Thunder Bay Field Naturalists, among others.

#### Enjoy two free public presentations!

At 7 p.m. join David Phillips, Senior Climatologist for Environment & Climate Change Canada, for "Thunder Bay's Weather – Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow," which will explore a reconstruction of the Thunder Bay region's climate history. Then at 8:30 p.m. join Travis Novitsky, a proud citizen of Grand Portage Anishinaabe Nation, as he shares his passion for nature and wildlife photography.



## July 11: Farm & Food

Come and meet experts from Science North, Thunder Bay Horticultural Society, Thunder Bay Master Gardeners, Roots Community Food Centre (formerly known as Roots to Harvest), Sleepy G Farm, and Canada West Maple and learn about food science, technology and horticultural history in fun and immersive ways.
