Council would like the Clerk-Treasurer to enquire if this additional levy could be included as a COVID-19 expense for the COVID-19 funding provided by the Province.

Additional pandemic costs are projected to total approximately \$649,500 for 2020 with at this point no additional funding has been announced. ii) Municipal Delegation requests for the ROMA conference were discussed. Council would like to request a virtual meeting with the Minister of Transportation with regard to the condition of Highway 595.

The Township of O'Connor's allocation is \$100,000.00 for this new stream. The federal government will cover 80% of the total eligible costs associated with any approved project and the Ontario government will cover 20%. The total eligible costs for all submitted projects cannot exceed the municipalities allocation.
- b) Sheelagh Hendrick letter regarding the Integrity Commissioner and Closed Meeting Investigator Contract. The Township of O'Connor's contract with Ms. Hendrick is

expiring on December 31, 2020 and she will not be reapplying for this position. Council would like the Clerk-Treasurer to reach out to Mr. Matson and Mr. Commisso, who were also appointed to these positions for the Township to see if they are still interested in the position for a new term.

c) The Township of O'Connor's Multi-Year Accessibility Plan 2016 – 2020 was reviewed. No comments were received from the residents. Several changes will be made to update the Plan and it will be brought back to Council for approval.

- a) Marcus Powlowski, MP regarding Universal Broadband Fund. This funding will help improve high-speed internet access and mobile connectivity across Canada, including the communities here in the Thunder Bay – Rainy River District. The government is also committing to secure low-earth-orbit satellite capacity through Telesat, in order to provide high-speed internet to the most rural and remote parts of Canada.
- b) AMO Policy Update November 9, 2020 regarding the \$1.75 Billion Announced for Broadband Across Canada.
- c) The District of Thunder Bay Social Services Administration Board (TBDSSAB) COVID-19 Update to Member Municipalities.
